Josef Ackermann to Receive 2007 Global Leadership Award from the American Institute for Contemporary German Studies

Dr. Josef Ackermann, Chairman of the Management Board and the Group Executive Committee of Deutsche Bank AG, will receive the 2007 Global Leadership Award from the American Institute for Contemporary German Studies (AICGS) at a gala dinner in New York on November 15th.

Approximately four hundred business and government leaders from Germany, the U.S. and other countries will attend the gala, the first of which was held in 1994.

According the Jackson Janes, PhD, Executive Director of AICGS, the Institute "presents the Global Leadership Award each year to a prominent international business figure who has demonstrated unique leadership that strengthens and reinforces the bonds between Germany and the United States. This special evening, which is attended by hundreds of the most prominent business and political figures from both Germany and the United States, highlights the critical role that a strong German-American dialogue plays in transatlantic relations." "I am delighted and honored to receive the Global Leadership Award from an institution that has done so much to foster and nurture a productive dialogue between Germany and the United States," said Dr. Ackermann. "We at Deutsche Bank are committed to the continued strength of the alliance between these nations and to the ongoing positive influence this alliance has had on the world at large," he continued.
